Fluorescent Tubes & Bulbs*

Compact fluorescent lights and tubes can be recycled at a variety of locations. Visit takeitbacknetwork.org for locations, fees and details. Items are also accepted at the Auburn SuperMall Wastemobile (see below for details).

Rechargeable Batteries & Cell Phones*

Rechargeable batteries and cell phones can be recycled at a variety of electronics, office supply and building supply stores. Visit call2recycle.org for locations and details.

Used Motor Oil*

Used motor oil can be recycled at your curb or at most auto parts stores.

Curbside: Place oil in sealed gallon jugs with your name and address on your recycling day (limit 3 gallons per pickup).

Stores: Most auto part stores will accept used motor oil for recycling. Call ahead for quantities and restrictions.

Automotive Batteries*

Automotive and boat batteries can be recycled for free at most auto parts stores. Call ahead for quantities and restrictions.

Tires

Tires are accepted for a fee at most tire retailers. Call ahead for quantities, fees and restrictions.

Motor Vehicles*

Contact auto wreckers for disposal of vehicles or donate to a charity.

Oil-Based Paint, Chemicals & Pesticides*

The Household Hazardous Wastemobile and other hazardous waste sites accept a variety of hazardous materials including oil-based paint, chemicals, cleaners, pesticides and insecticides (see below for details).

Latex Paint

Latex is not accepted at the household hazardous waste facilities. It can now be put in the garbage, as long as it is dried up or solidified. Mix paint with equal parts cat litter, shredded paper, sawdust or commercial paint hardener. After solidified, place in garbage with lid off.

Needles & Sharps*

Used needles and sharps are dangerous in garbage because they can injure sorters and spread diseases. Mail in programs are available: Search online for “sharps mail in programs”. Call ahead for fees and restrictions.

RECYCLING INFORMATION

The City of Federal Way contracts with Waste Management for collection. Contact Waste Management at 800.592.9995 or wmnorthwest.com/fedway to start, cancel or change garbage, recycling or yard waste service.

With all-in-one recycling, all recyclables go in your cart and you no longer need your "bottles and cans" bin. Keep for extra storage or place at the curb on recycling day marked "dispose."

If you often have extra recyclables, contact Waste Management to order a larger cart at no additional charge.

Food Scrap Recycling

Food scraps and food-soiled paper can be placed in your yard waste cart and recycled into compost. Wrap food scraps in newspaper or place in a paper sack to reduce mess and keep your cart clean. Waste Management will clean carts for \$10.00. Compost Bin Sale

The City of Federal Way offers discounts on compost bins, worm bins and food scrap collection containers.
