CITYWIDE NEWS Federal Way FWPD FOCUSES ON ITS RECRUITMENT PLANNING STRATEGY FOR 2024

The Federal Way Police Department (FWPD) has set a goal to recruit more candidates in 2024. To achieve this, FWPD increased the size of its recruiting team to 10 members.

The expansion will help our FWPD attract quality candidates from diverse backgrounds.

To make the recruitment process more effective, the department has launched a new website (<u>fwrecruiting.com</u>) that provides potential applicants with information and opportunities.

Our FWPD plans on participating in community and military recruiting events we will actively engage with potential candidates and showcase the best of our department!

In 2023, the FWPD recruited nearly 40 staff members, setting a positive precedent for

our 2024 recruitment goals. To make the application process more accessible and efficient, FWPD has collaborated with Public Safety Testing to streamline its initial testing process for police officer positions.

Lateral and entry-level applicants are offered incentives, such as a signing bonus for lateral applicants and a simplified testing process, including remote interviews and exams.

Overall, FWPD's recruitment plan for 2024 is a comprehensive approach, leveraging traditional and innovative methods to build a skilled, diverse, and dedicated police force.





MAYOR FERRELL MEETS NEW PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERAL WAY KOREAN-AMERICAN ASSOCIATION!









On February 3, the Mayor, City Council, and City Staff met with members of the Public at their Annual Retreat at Dumas Bay Centre. This meeting allowed the Council to discuss many topics in an open forum, with no decisions or actions being taken.

This Retreat is like an extended study session.

Some notable items from the meeting:

• A new language was proposed that would not have the City Clerk read all code numbers while reading an ordinance at the Council Meetings. This will be brought forth for consideration and action at a future City Council meeting.

• Councilmember Honda presented the last update to the City Council Vision and Goals, completed in 2020. Through the discussion, it was noted that these goals have held up well in the four years since their inception and will be discussed further in a future study session.

• Joining Director Niven was Trent Mummery, President/ CEO of Trent Development, working with the City to develop TC-3.

- City Administrator Davis brought up all the budgetary items to be known going into the 2024 biennial budget conversations. Discussions on the budget for 2025-2026 will begin in the fall, with final approval before the year's final meeting.
- Director Walsh gave a presentation regarding the new O&M Facility, which will be on the agenda tonight at LUTC for further discussion. This will also be a topic of conversation for an upcoming Special Council Meeting later this month.




