## MAYOR FERRELL DELIVERS A HEARTFELT AND MEMORABLE PRESENTATION AT THE MLK DAY CELEBRATION




The 2024 MLK Day Celebration on January 15 at the PAEC had the theme of "Building Community Bridges." During the event, Federal Way Mayor Jim Ferrell delivered an inspiring message, highlighting critical moments in the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The Federal Way Diversity Commission collaborated with the Federal Way Public School (FWPS) and Multi-Service Center (MSC) to organize the MLK event. MSC organized a food drive at the PAEC to give back to our community.

Each January, the Federal Way Diversity Commission sponsors a community event in honor of the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The Commission breaks into a subcommittee that performs the legwork to accomplish all of the tasks. This year's MLK Community Event Subcommittee comprises Commissioners Trenise Rogers, Ron Walker, and Lisa Wallace.

This year, the subcommittee focused on *Building Community Bridges*, bringing with them the five pillars of community building: to live, learn, work, worship, and play. With a focus on community building, the keynote speaker on January 15 was Lawrence Garrett of the 828 Group — a community advocacy group.

# CELEBRATING CITY COMMISSIONS

Through continued fostering of the relationship with community partners, the Federal Way Public Schools (FWPS), and the City of Federal Way, this event will highlight many FWPS students, including the Todd Beamer High School choir, who kicked off the event with the singing of the National Anthem and the Black National Anthem.

Dr. King was born on January 15, 1929, and was a minister, activist, philosopher, and one of the most prolific Civil Rights Movement leaders in the 1950s-1960s. Dr. King was known for his nonviolent and peaceful protests, using a legacy of love to show the possibility of growth into a new foundation and way of thinking.

"Dr. King's legacy is a living example of the highest quality and attributes of mankind," said Rogers. "This legacy has impacts from generation to generation, from the youngest of children seeking a voice to the oldest person sharing their wisdom and experience."





The MLK Day Celebration encouraged visitors to do the following: use your voice, share your heart, and remember that you are never too young — or too old — to make a difference. The subcommittee thanked staff member Levi Luft for their care and compassion, which was evident and intentional throughout the planning process.

"They [Luft] have made this such a fluid process," said Rogers.

The subcommittee thanks its sponsors, Northwest Church, BECU, and Dori Peterson (who sponsored the MLK Essay Contest), and the nine vendors for their engagement and enthusiasm for this event, including the "Fill-A-Truck" Food Drive with the Multi-Service Center (MSC) in Federal Way.

# MAYOR FERRELL OPENED THE FWCC AS A WARMING SHELTER AND ACTIVATED FUSION'S EMERGENCY COLD OVERNIGHT SHELTER TO PROTECT FEDERAL WAY RESIDENTS



As our community deals with freezing temperatures in the region, Mayor Ferrell took quick action by working with FUSION Transitional Housing in Federal Way to activate its emergency cold overnight shelter for the unhoused community from January 11 through January 14.

"The overnight severe cold weather shelter in Federal Way is activated by me or a designee when the following happens: Temperatures fall below 32 degrees for at least 24 consecutive hours or exceed three inches of daily snow accumulation, or other conditions are presently deemed severe enough to present a substantial threat to the life or health of people experiencing homelessness in Federal Way," said the Mayor.

Ferrell announced on January 8 that the Federal Way Community Center (FWCC) at 876 S. 333rd Street would be available as a warming center during the day from January 11 through January 14.

"The safety of Federal Way residents is my top priority," said Ferrell. "We are committed to doing everything possible to protect our unhoused community during these cold temperatures in our region."

# THE ANIMAL SERVICES UNIT OF THE FWPD WORKS TO REDUCE ANIMAL HOMELESSNESS IN OUR COMMUNITY



Meet The Team! The City of Federal Way thanks Animal Services Officers Dayna Larson (left) and Jill Gallagher (right) for their dedicated service to our community. They're highly skilled in addressing aggressive animals, loose dogs, and disruptive barking concerns. They are committed to educating the community on responsible pet ownership.

Here are facts related to pets:

- All cats and dogs over five months old must be licensed in the City of Federal Way, and licensing requires a current rabies vaccination.
- Pet licensing can be completed online by <u>clicking on this link</u>.
   Licensing can also be completed through mail-in applications or in person at the Federal Way Police Department lobby.

In 2011, the Federal Way Police Department (FWPD) established the Animal Services Unit to safeguard the welfare of all beings in the community.

Our team of two Animal Service Officers (ASOs) strives to help our community by reducing animal homelessness, reuniting lost pets with their owners, and upholding animal welfare regulations.

We work with The Humane Society for Tacoma & Pierce County to handle stray impounded animals, provide licensing services, reunite lost animals with their owners, and find adoptive homes for stray animals.


The Humane Society also helps in animal abuse investigations, providing holding areas for quarantined and dangerous animals.











The City of Federal Way, in partnership with committed community residents, is sponsoring a FREE course teaching beginning financial management skills.

This weekly course will take place on **Wednesday** evenings from January 24 through March 20 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the Federal Way Community Center (FWCC).

The course utilizes *Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University* materials and group discussion.

The topics include wisdom and common sense to help sharpen skills in budgeting, paying off debt, increasing savings for emergencies, home ownership, and education expenses.

Each family will receive a workbook with financial planning software for post-course planning.

**Location**: Federal Way Community Center

Dates: January 24 through March 20, 2024

**Time:** 6:30-8:30 p.m.

Cost: Free to Federal Way residents

Class Size: Limited to 40 participants

Registration: Registration will be through the Evite website (below).

**Curriculum:** The course utilizes *Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University* materials and group discussion.

**Child care:** Child care will be provided by the Federal Way Community Center for children up to age 8 years. A total of 20 children can be accommodated.

**Youth Attendance:** Children ages 9-12 are welcome to attend the class with their parents if they are interested. Otherwise a room will be provided for them where they can read or do homework. This room will be monitored by an adult volunteer who can assist with homework. Up to 30 youth can be accommodated.

**Course Completion Incentives:** There will be a \$50 gift card given to those who complete at least 7 of the 9 classes.





- One copy each of utility bill paid in 2023 for the following utilities only:

  - O Documentation must show the bill was paid.
  - O DO NOT send original bills. Paperwork will NOT be returned.
