

It's an icy wonder and reflects how chilly it has been in our community.


Remember to bundle up, stay warm, and stay safe outside.

Established in 1955, the Kiwanis Club of Federal Way has lived its mission of *"Improving the world, one child and one community at a time."*

A candlelight ceremony inspired the Community Flame in 1999. Throughout the last 25 years, there have been five iterations of this flame representing community and building a great place to live, learn, work, worship, and play.

This year, representing **Live** was Senior Advisory Commissioner Frank Fields, a Federal Way resident for 41 years.

Representing **Learn** was retired Federal Way High School English Teacher Pam Ashe, who taught for 50 years, including 31 years dedicated to educating the students of Federal Way.

Representing **Work** was Katie Krause, a Chamber of Commerce member who has worked within Federal Way primarily for 15 years. Pastor Gordon Banks from Overcomer Covenant Church represented **Worship**.


Representing **Play** was Evan Cook, a youth mentor, coach, and former Eastern Washington University football

player who has lived in Federal Way for 14 years. On behalf of the **City**, Council President Kochmar represented the government and citywide leadership.

This flame was lit as a reminder to continue cultivating community bridges, welcoming those new to the City, returning to the City, and celebrating the current residents of the City of Federal Way as a great place to live, learn, work, worship, and play.







The City of Federal Way, in partnership with committed community residents, is sponsoring a FREE course teaching beginning financial management skills.

This weekly course will take place on Wednesday evenings from January 24 through March 20 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. at the Federal Way Community Center (FWCC).

The course utilizes *Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University* materials and group discussion.

The topics include wisdom and common sense to help sharpen skills in budgeting, paying off debt, increasing savings for emergencies, home ownership, and education expenses.

Each family will receive a workbook with financial planning software for post-course planning.

Dates: January 24 through March 20, 2024

Time: 6:30-8:30 p.m.

Cost: Free to Federal Way residents

Class Size: Limited to 40 participants

**Curriculum:** The course utilizes *Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University* materials and group discussion.

**Child care:** Child care will be provided by the Federal Way Community Center for children up to age 8 years. A total of 20 children can be accommodated.

**Youth Attendance:** Children ages 9-12 are welcome to attend the class with their parents if they are interested. Otherwise a room will be provided for them where they can read or do homework. This room will be monitored by an adult volunteer who can assist with homework. Up to 30 youth can be accommodated.

**Course Completion Incentives:** There will be a \$50 gift card given to those who complete at least 7 of the 9 classes.



### ENROLLMENT PERIOD: JANUARY 1 – MAY 30, 2024

#### **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

• U.S. Individual Tax Return Form 1040 for 2023 (if one was filed);

• Bank statements for November and December 2023 (if no income tax return was filed) showing all sources of income including Social Security Income .

#### AND

- One copy each of utility bill paid in 2023 for the following utilities only:
  - O Gas, Electric, Water, Sewer, Garbage, and Telephone/Cell Phone/Cable
  - O Documentation must show the bill was paid.
  - O DO NOT send original bills. Paperwork will NOT be returned.
