What's next?


In Fall 2017, the City re-initiated the Federal Way City Center Access Project. The City has worked with its partners at WSDOT, FHWA, King County, Sound Transit, King County Metro, and more, to identify project issues and potential solutions. The City has considered the following types of improvements:

- Roadway capacity improvements
- Transit and high occupancy vehicle (HOV) priority treatments (such as bus or HOV lanes, or signal queue jumps)
- Pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- New roadway crossings of I-5

The study team concluded only revised access to I-5 will improve City Center congestion. The map on the next page highlights areas the City is evaluating for ramp modifications which, packaged with various potential local improvements, would deliver the greatest benefit to traffic flow. Please attend a neighborhood briefing to learn more about possible changes at S 312th Street, S 324th Street, combination interchange options, and local projects.

The City of Federal Way's City Center Access Study is the first step of the Project and will identify a solution to traffic congestion in the City Center area (defined as the vicinity of S 320th Street between SR 99/Pacific Highway and Military Road S). The solution could involve changes in a broader area, as shown on the map.

The study team is charged with identifying a solution that will improve economic vitality and quality of life in the study area and maintain the integrity of the interstate system. The key goals of the solution are to:

- Improve mobility by decreasing congestion on S 320th Street, reducing the effects of traffic on transit and the general traveling public
- Maintain or improve access to and from the City Center
- Provide opportunities for traffic to travel around rather than through the core
- Improve non-motorized mobility

This study is identified in the City of Federal Way Six-Year Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) as an environmental documentation study.

The City is conducting the study in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC), Sound Transit, Pierce Transit, South King Fire and Rescue, and King County.
